About the Book

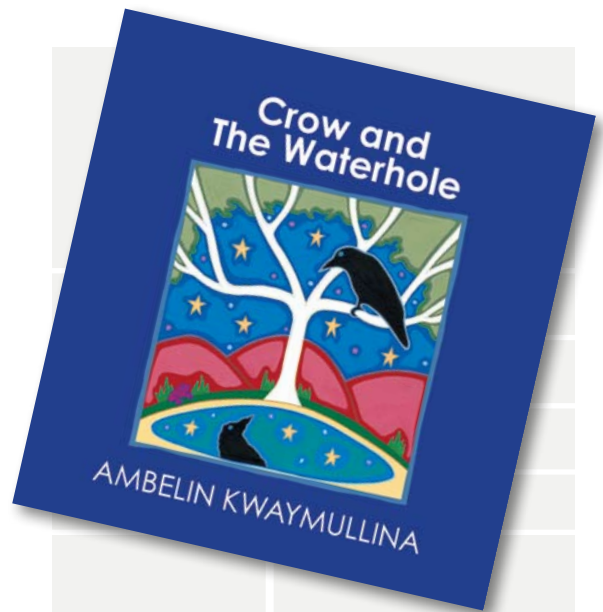
