About the Authors

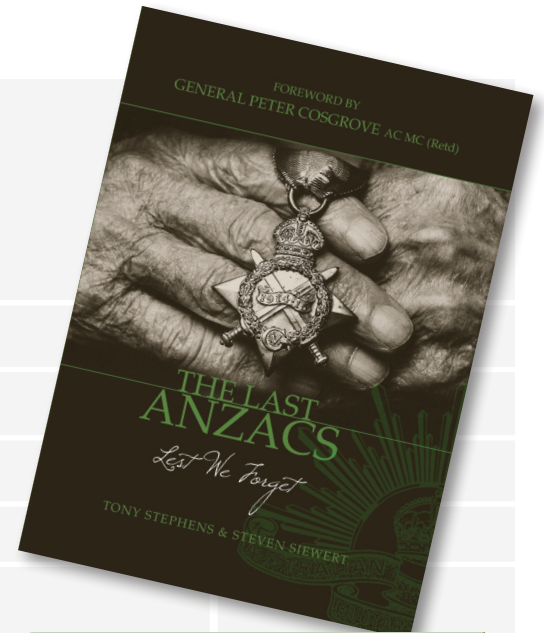
Tony Stephens was born in Goulburn in 1939, three weeks after the outbreak of World War II, in which his father was killed by the Japanese.

Steven Siewert was born in Sydney in 1964, the son of a German father and Irish mother who came to Australia after World War II. He is a photographer with the *Sydney Morning Herald*.
