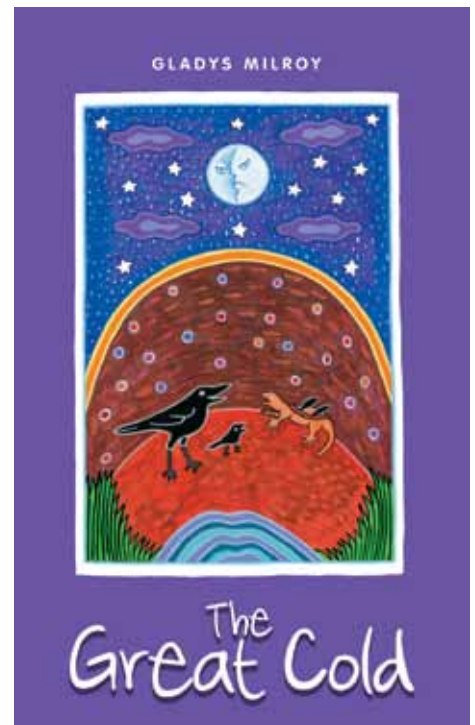
### ABOUT THE AUTHOR
